Joy Johnson, SFU	I wish to speak before the Mayors' Council regarding: On behalf of Simon Fraser University, I would like to present to the Mayors' Council the university's support for the Burnaby Mountain Urban Transit Gondola. The specific action I want the Mayors' Council to take is: Support and move forward with the inclusion of the project in future funding planning for design and construction.
2. Mario Guisado	I wish to speak before the Mayors' Council regarding: I represent the UniverCity Community Association The specific action I want the Mayors' Council to take is: Specifically focused on transportation options impacting the UniverCity neighbourhood.
3. Nathan Davidowicz	I wish to speak before the Mayors' Council regarding: 10 years priorities The specific action I want the Mayors' Council to take is:

4. Joe A Kunzler	<p>I wish to speak before the Mayors' Council regarding: The 2022 Investment Plan</p> <p>The specific action I want the Mayors' Council to take is: a) Pass Transport 2050. Transport 2050 IS an athletic plan - gritty, ingenious, and moving forward, building on past successful pilot projects like the electric buses on Route 100, RapidBus, and building out the Bus Lane Network to move people, not cars. b) Put Minister Bowinn Ma in the plan c) Make a list of preparers for Transport 2050 to honor ALL staff. ALL.</p>
5. Glen Porter	<p>I wish to speak before the Mayors' Council regarding: The Burnaby Mountain Gondola</p> <p>The specific action I want the Mayors' Council to take is: Hear community concerns</p>
6. Christine Cunningham	<p>I wish to speak before the Mayors' Council regarding: Removing the Burnaby Mountain gondola project from the current 10 year transportation plan because (1) TransLink has failed to update its flawed business case for this project, and (2) the City of Burnaby approved this project in a closed door meeting, fundamentally breaching the democratic rights of Burnaby citizens who wished to speak against the project.</p> <p>The specific action I want the Mayors' Council to take is: To remove the Burnaby mountain gondola from the current 10 year list of transportation priorities or, failing that, to remove it from the list of priorities until such time as TransLink has updated its business case and until a new City Council is elected in Burnaby on October 15, 2022.</p>
7. Alex Boston	<p>I wish to speak before the Mayors' Council regarding: Identifying challenges to meeting Transport 2050 goals and opportunities for strengthening revenue and ridership to deliver on 10 Year Investment Priorities</p> <p>The specific action I want the Mayors' Council to take is: 1. Build on TransLink's Supportive Policy Agreements for big infrastructure investments and TransLink's Transit Service Guidelines to grow ridership and revenue 2. Take advantage of under-utilized transit land assets for developing mobility hubs that address multiple, mutually reinforcing priorities: TransLink ridership and rental revenue; zero</p>

	carbon, affordable housing and transportation; provincial prefabricated, mass timber industrial development.
